- Programs specifically designed for at risk students
- Programs that encourage differentiated instruction

- Instructional materials that have ongoing use are preferred as to disposable/one-time items.

What OSF cannot fund:

- Food for events
- Prizes
- District required textbooks
- Projects that are intended to create a non-profit or for-profit venture
- Workshop or professional development fees that do not directly relate to students and clasroom project
- Reimbursement for previously incurred expenses
- Substitute teachers
- Portions of another larger grant
- Stipends to pay OCS teachers for summer/extra work
- Costs to bring in a staff development expert
- Projects that cannot be implemented within one vear
- Projects written by anyone other than Oregon City
 School District teachers, staff and students
- Projects that have not been approved by a department head and or school principal
