



Highlights from the Classroom Grants during the 2016-2017 school year.

Coral Propagation Clay Environmental & Ag Technologies

The tank and setup is one of the few of it's kind in the country and provides Clay students with the very unique opportunity to interact hands on with water quality issues, coral propagation, biodiversity, environmental monitoring, biosecurity and record keeping.

<u>Feedback:</u> "Coral takes a lot of work but gives us the opportunity to learn new things about them. Now that we have this coral we are planning on doing proficiency awards that can be for additional leadership skills and other learning experiences." -Kelsey Meldrum, Junior Student, Class of 2018

Thermo-Imaging Camera Clay Industrial and Electrical Engineering

A thermal imager takes non-contact, infrared temperature measurements that capture an object's temperature profile as a two-dimensional picture.

Analyzing these thermo-pictures, early equipment damage or malfunction an easily be detected. This allows students with an opportunity to gain experience with test & measurement equipment used in many facets of manufacturing environments.



<u>Feedback:</u> "The students in the EIE program are enthusiastic to utilize the thermo camera as a diagnostic tool to identify items that need further attention. They have commented that it is "easy to use" and "shows better detail than I thought". —Nick Elchert, Teacher
